OBSTRUCTION PERMIT

This permit allows the bearer to obstruct a road and/or sidewalk in accordance with city ordinance **(74-3) Obstruction - Permits**. This permit is only valid for the location, date and times specified on this permit. This permit is non-transferable and granted only to the applicant and/or organization listed below. The chief of police may impose reasonable safety restrictions upon this permit.

The City of Douglasville is not liable for any injuries an applicant, participant or spectator may sustain during the event.

This permit may be revoked by the chief of police or his designee at any time if there is a substantial threat or impediment to public safety or to traffic efficiency. The city council and the chief of police may also impose reasonable conditions upon this permit including but not limited to scope, date, time, location, and security requirements.

Sec. 74-3. - Obstruction permits.

When and where it shall be necessary in the construction or repair of buildings, sheds, sidewalks, etc., and any other proper cases, the mayor may issue written permits for definite lengths of time, not exceeding one year, permitting the applicant therefor to obstruct the free and unimpeded use of the streets or sidewalks of the city by depositing on such streets or sidewalks or fixing or suspending over such streets or sidewalks any object or body. The provisions of any conditions which may be stated in such permit shall be strictly adhered to. The mayor and city council, and the police chief, are each likewise empowered to issue written permission for the temporary obstruction of streets in proper cases.
